

## **Data protection information pursuant to Art. 13 & Art. 14 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) for video surveillance at the Mannheim site**

### *1. Name and contact details of the controller and data protection officer*

### *2. Purposes and legal basis of data processing*

#### *2.1 General video surveillance*

Video surveillance is carried out to protect property rights, to deter theft and vandalism, to investigate theft and damage to property, and also to implement the necessary technical and organisational measures relating to data and information security.

The legal basis is Art. 6(1)(f) GDPR.

## 2.2 Vehicle number plate recognition by video

Vehicle number plate recognition by video is carried out for the purposes of enforcing property rights and facilitating access to the company premises in Mannheim. A video camera records vehicle number plates at the entrances to the car park and underground car park and compares them with the vehicle number plates of those authorised to park there.

The legal basis is Art. 6 (1) (f) GDPR.

## 3. *Legitimate interests pursued*

### 3.1 General video surveillance

Our legitimate interest lies in protecting our property, preventing or investigating criminal offences, asserting, exercising or defending legal claims, and controlling unauthorised access.

### 3.2 Vehicle number plate recognition by means of video

Our legitimate interest consists of controlling unauthorised access and simplifying access to our company premises by motor vehicles.

## 4. *Storage period / deletion periods*

### 4.1 General video surveillance

Depending on the risk area, the recordings are stored for a period of 72 hours up to a maximum of seven days and then automatically deleted. If an incident occurs, the recordings are stored for the duration of the investigation and prosecution of the incident or the exercise, assertion or defence of any legal claims and then deleted.

### 4.2 Vehicle number plate recognition by means of video

The recordings are deleted immediately after the vehicle registration number has been checked against a list of authorised parkers.

## 5. *Your rights*

You have the following rights vis-à-vis us, which you can assert in each case against the body named in section 1:

- **Right to information:** You are entitled at any time to request confirmation from the controller as to whether personal data concerning you is being processed. If this is the case, you may, within the framework of the legal provisions of Art. 15 GDPR, request information free of charge about your data processed by us, the purposes of the processing, the storage period or the criteria for determining the storage period and the recipients of the data.

- Right to erasure: You have the right to request that the controller erase personal data concerning you without undue delay if one of the reasons listed in detail in Art. 17 GDPR applies, e.g. if the data is no longer required for the purposes pursued.
- Right to restriction of processing: You have the right to request that the controller restrict processing if one of the conditions listed in Art. 18 GDPR applies, e.g. if the data subject has objected to the processing, for the duration of the controller's review.
- Right to object: You have the right to object at any time, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to the processing of data concerning you by us on the basis of Art. 6(1)(f) GDPR (legitimate interest of the controller). In this case, we will no longer process the data concerning you unless we can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing which override your interests, rights and freedoms, or the processing serves to assert, exercise or defend legal claims (Art. 21 GDPR). Please send any objections to the address given in section 1.
- Right to lodge a complaint: Without prejudice to any other administrative or judicial remedy, you have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you consider that the processing of personal data concerning you infringes the GDPR (Art. 77 GDPR). You can exercise this right with a supervisory authority in the Member State of your residence, your place of work or the place of the alleged infringement.
